## A busy year - Chair's Report

I am delighted to introduce this review of our work covering two years from September 2022 to September 2024.

We paused much of our activity in 2023 because of uncertainty about funding, however we were able to commission someone to review and update our website. (One of the outcomes of that work is our website always comes first in any in Google search).

We were able to secure funding in the second half of 2023 to support the implementation of our strategic plan. Thanks to the Diocese of Leeds for their commitment and to the Catholic Bishops Conference of England and Wales who have awarded us a grant in 2023 and now 2024 from the Day for Life fund. This has enabled us to

The new funding has made it possible to take advantage of the freelance services of Greg Mulholland who supports the

trustees in their work.

I am grateful to the trustees of GOG who have a wealth of experience and skills and who all have contributed to the sessions we have provided.

Thanks also to Sir Harold Hood Foundation and the Charlotte Marshall Gift Fund who have awarded us grants.

Faith in Elderly People is a local project that this year decided to formally dissolve and we were very pleased to receive a contribution to our costs when they dispersed their funds

### Immaculate Heart of Mary Befriending Service

The parish of Immaculate Heart of Mary in Huddersfield is centred around our two churches, English Martyrs' in Dalton and St Joseph's in Aspley.

In 2022 we ran a pilot befriending scheme to get in touch with housebound older people (anyone born in 1930's) who may benefit from a regular well-being telephone call.

Following a recent parish appeal, we launched the scheme with three people making up the team. We offer information about parish events, dates of Masses for the sick, offers of lifts with SVP support for those who

otherwise would not be able to attend, the provision of a soup lunch & cake lunch and a chance to meet others after the service.



Offers of prayers, together with a regular well-being chat will take place with the aim of understanding through ongoing friendship, relating to a person's

needs, that the parish may be unaware of and with which if shared, the parish may be able to offer assistance.

The calls have been initially made from the sacristy so recipients can be assured of their authenticity, however, once the relationship has been established, the caller may use their home phone to make the contacts, the work load will be fairly distributed between the three of us.

The befriending service is a really easy way to engage with and involve people in our parish.
